Parents, below are a couple of ideas you can use at home to reinforce and further teach on the Bible story.

“This week we learned a new Bible story. Can you remind me what it was about? Excellent. Let’s do a couple of things to help us remember what we learned!”

Overview:

Bible Basis: Judges 4:1-16; 5:4, 20-21

Bible Truth: *I have God’s power too!*

Snack Idea - Palm Tree:

Supplies: Pretzels, sliced apples

- Create a palm tree!
- Use the pretzel as the trunk and the sliced apples as the leaves.

Pray: Thank You, Jesus, for your power. I love You! Thank You for today’s snack. In Jesus’ name, amen. Then eat and practice the Bible truth, *I have God’s Power too!*

Craft - Strong Chariots:

Supplies:

- Plastic or Styrofoam cup
- Scissors
- String
- Paper
- Markers, crayons or pencil crayons

How to do it:

- Cut the cup in half vertically
- Poke holes (about an inch above the bottom) in both sides of the cup, next to the cut side
- Cut the paper into two circles that can be used as wheels and poke a hole in the center
- Thread the string through the holes of the cup and the wheels (attaching them)
- (See picture example)
- Practice the Bible truth, *I have God’s Power too!*



Activity:

Start by asking a few questions:

- “What was the Bible story about?”
- “What is the Bible truth?”
- “Can you tell and show me the Bible truth?”

Activity Time: *I've Got the Power*

Supplies:

- A bean bag or soft stuffed animal

How to play:

- Game is played similarly to *Hot Potato*
- Have the children sit in a circle (or across from you if you are playing with a single child)
- Use the bean bag or stuffed animal to represent the “power”
- Pass it around the circle, while playing music
- Stop the music – whoever has the “power” is out that round (and gets to control the music for the next round)
