In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace, which he lavished upon us, in all wisdom and insight.

In Him – only In Christ

- When Paul says, “In him” or “In Christ,” he is stating that ONLY through a relationship with Jesus Christ can we experience blessing. In verse 7, this is the concept of redemption.
- Relationship with Jesus Christ is only possible when we choose to believe that He died on the cross to pay for our sins.

We have redemption

- Redemption is defined as the act of redeeming or being redeemed, and it comes from the root word “redeem.”
- By the power of Jesus, we are no longer obligated to pay the penalty for our sin. Jesus has taken care of it all!

Through His Blood

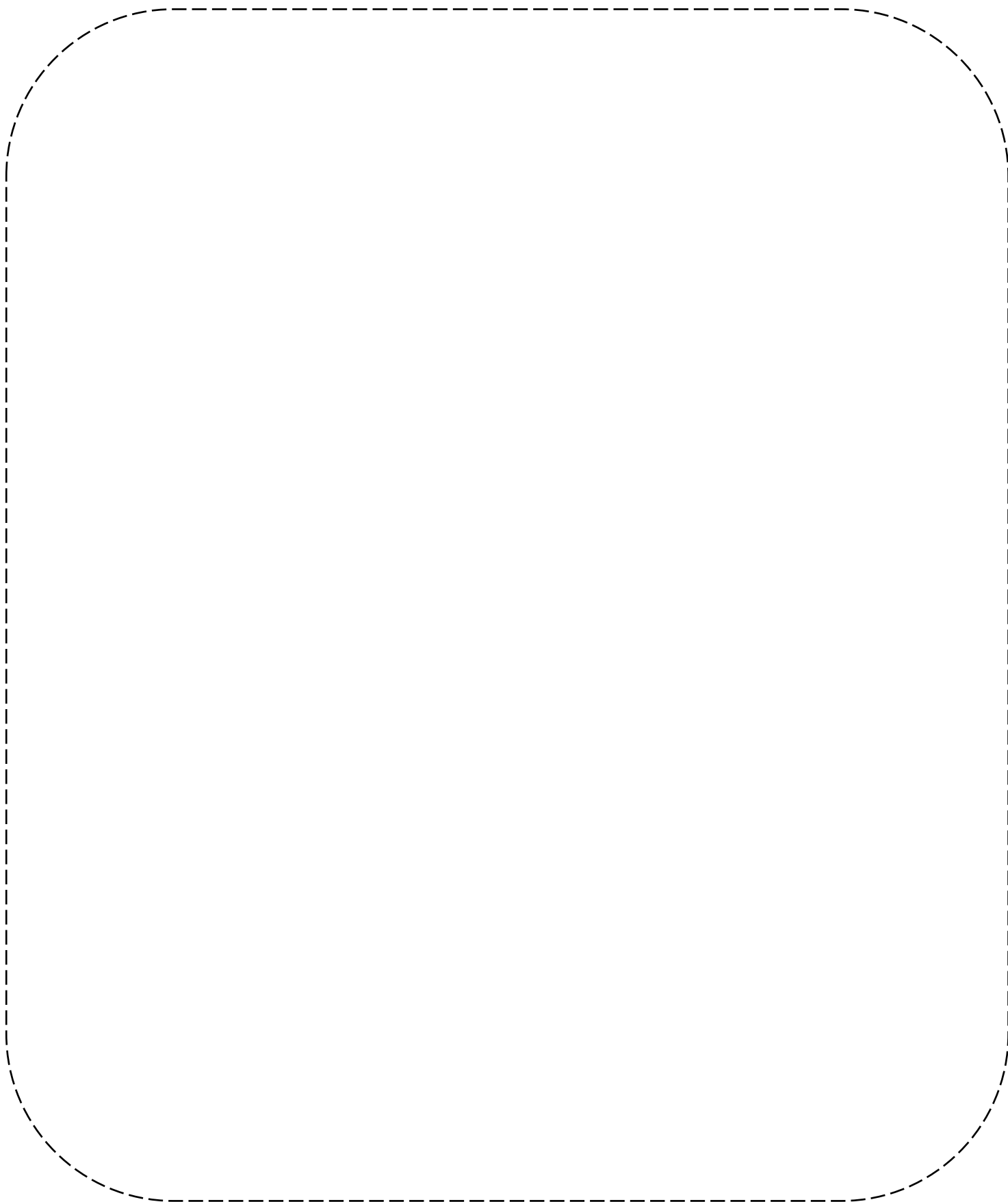
- When Jesus died on the cross for our sins, Jesus willingly shed His blood for us on the cross. He secured eternal redemption for us; because of His blood, we have forgiveness of our sin. This isn’t a simple fix; this is permanent, forever redemption – because God, the Son, paid the penalty Himself!
